Christmas Events

Firstly, the Nativity Carol Concert at St Mary's will be on the afternoon of **Friday 15**th **December**. This will start at 2pm and all are welcome to attend this beautiful seasonal event.

On the morning of that day we are also having Breakfast with Santa at the school from 8am. The kitchens will be preparing pastries and coffee/tea for adults and Christmas biscuits and juice for the children. Santa will be popping along to meet everyone. Coffee and a pastry will be £2 for adults and a drink and a Christmas biscuit will be £1 for children. On that day all drop off will be on the Colleges playground with food and drink served from the Mix. The Mix will be relocated to the school hall for that day. This is part of a fundraiser for the Friends that day, which will also include a Christmas bake sale after school when we all get back from St Mary's. The Friends of Feoffment will need some volunteers to help with the running of these events, so please look out for the request message and help out.

After the breakfast the children will be visited by Santa in their classrooms and they will be able to give a personal Christmas letter to Santa to take back to the North Pole. We will be writing the letters to Santa in school, which will be a combination of questions for him to answer, a Christmas present request and a wish for something lovely to happen in the year ahead. The day before (**Thursday 14**th **December**) will be Christmas dinner at school and our Christmas jumper day. As usual children can pay £1 to wear their jumper, with all proceeds going to the Friends of Feoffment. The children can order a Christmas dinner on the day as usual.

In the last week of the term, Year 2 will be performing their Christmas play 'A star for the Carpenter's Arms'. Tickets will be £2 each and families will be limited to two per performance initially. Performances will be on **Monday 18th December at 6pm and Tuesday 19th at 2pm**. Book tickets on school money from the 6th December. There will also be a raffle at each performance for the Friends of Feoffment, so please bring £1 for a ticket for this too.

There will also be a Christmas Elf raffle on each of the last three days of the term. Children can pay £1 to enter all 3 raffles. There will be a prize for the winner, but also the children will put a member of staff's name on the back of the ticket and this person will be transformed into an elf for a day. This will be repeated for each of the last three days.

SumDog

As some of you in KS2 will know we have been trialing a app for helping build the children's confidence and fluency with number skills in three classes this term. The trial for SumDog is now over, but we will be rolling it out across Years 2, 3, 4 and 5 after Christmas.

The app allows the children to access some practice maths games at their level and develop their fluency in this area. It is based around a very game based model which the children really enjoy. The trial ran for three weeks and across the three classes 14,000 questions were answered. The children will get given a login fairly soon and will do an assessment task in school. After that they will be set some homework of playing the app for a period of time. This can be played on a tablet, phone or laptop.
