## Welcome back

We are having a drive for improved manners and curtesy across the school and they have responded really well, meaning that the school is calm, polite and a great place for learning. You should have by now received a welcome newsletter from your teacher explaining the important details for your class. Alongside this you will have received a Curriculum Overview document for the first topic of the year. We have created a new curriculum map for the school and this is the first part of it to be shared. As the year goes on we will share the next block of work every half term. This will involve a combination of trips (local and further afield), visiting speakers and bought-in experiences delivered in school. Some of these trips and experiences will involve a parental contribution for us to afford them, but this year the Friends of Feoffment will also be subsidising trips across the school to help make it affordable for parents. Hopefully, you will be able to support these and help us provide as exciting an education for your children as possible. #### **New Website**

It's been restructured so that parents and visitors should be able to find the information they require quickly and easily. There is a parents section, which contains materials that you might find helpful. The Curriculum section is where we will share all the details of the new curriculum in the school and how we approach some subjects where we use purchased schemes. There is also materials and reading in here which parents should find helpful. It will be using the same web address as previously.

Alongside these areas, you should find up-to-date details of school systems and processes, policies and key information. The website's calendar section is now fully integrated with the school's Google calendar, so details of school events, trips, parent evening dates etc will be on the website as soon as decisions are made. Hopefully, this will be helpful for families keeping abreast of what is coming up.

## **Developing Reading**

Those of you who have been supporting your children with their reading in KS1 last year will have become very familiar with the importance of your child practising both their fluency, using an easily decodable text, and extending their vocabulary and comprehension by sharing a more challenging book too.

This year we are starting to roll this strategy out across KS2. It is very clearly expressed in the DfE's recent publication 'The Reading Framework -July 2023', that developing fluency and prosody are vital is reading success. To this end, we have screened all the KS2 children for their reading fluency, and where their fluency is below the expectation for their year group we have encouraged them to choose one of their reading books to be a text that they can easily read. This book could be read once, but we highly recommend that it is read two or three times, as with each reread the children will be able to practise reading in a fluent manner and work on the expression and intonation of their reading. This is very much in line with the Little Wandle books which are read several times by our KS1 children. This book should not be the only reading material that your children are reading at home, and they should also be selecting books which spark their interest, extend their vocabulary and expose them to different genres. They should also be reading both fiction and non-fiction texts. The latter could be a magazine, newspaper, encyclopaedia, website etc.

On the school's website (in the parents section on English) there is a document which shares the range of questions you can be asking your children about the books that they are reading. We hope that you find these questions a helpful reference.

You will also have seen that the children have brought home new reading diaries. You will find that at the centre of these are a set of pages that you will find helpful for phonics and key vocabulary.

## **Uniform on PE days**

If your child is in KS1, we'd like you to please consider the clothing and shoe choices you use on PE days. When the children change for PE it is very helpful if shoes are either slip-on plimsolls or shoes with Velcro fasteners. We've seen lots of children wearing lace-up shoes, where they cannot do the laces up themselves. This results in staff needing to be regularly and repeatedly doing up laces. This obviously slows down changing times and therefore limits to time available for the children to be physically active, it also prevents staff from teaching in the session when they become untied. The same is also true of buttons and ties which the children can't manage themselves. Obviously we've no desire to put parents to more expense, but if you are able to use easy to change clothing on PE days that would be really helpful, thanks.

### **Outdoor Classroom**

We have been developing the outdoor courtyard space in the school, with the aim that it becomes an outdoor classroom, where a range of different lessons could be conducted in a pleasant outdoor environment. This should be a lovely new learning space in the school, and a chance for your children to engage in some nature in such an urban school setting. We are always on the lookout for donations of plants to help keep this area looking as lovely as possible for the children, so please do donate if you can.
